4. On the back of the poster, please list: Name of Fair (Clinton Spring Fair) and District 8. Owner of the

Poster and grade. We will require a full address of winners to send the poster on into the District 8

Competition, and may contact the school to help further identify winners.

- 5. Name and date of the fair must be clearly shown on the front of the poster.
- 6. The Society will be mounting the winning entry on BLACK Cardstock or Bristol board exposing

5.5 cm border on all four sides.

JUDGING CRITERIA:

- 1. Overall appearance 20 points
- 2. Attract and hold attention 25 points
- 3. Competition theme clear 40 points
- 4. Quality of material/end product 15 points

The winning poster from each class will be eligible to enter in the District 8 competition. The District 8 winner will compete for prizes at the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies convention in February 2024. Winning posters will be returned after the District competition.
