Section H. QUILTS

Entry tag fastened with safety pins or tape (No straight pins) Include name of Quilt Pattern.

HAND Quilted Rules: The Quilt must be solely made and quilted by the Exhibitor. Quilts to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches (832 cm) – all 4 sides must be measured to determine the perimeter measurement. The quilting must be through all 3 layers (top, batting and back). The name of quilt pattern must be on the entry tag.

MACHINE Quilted Rules: The quilt must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor. Quilts to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches (823 cm). All 4 sides must be measured to determine the perimeter measurement. The quilting must be through all 3 layers (top, batting and back). The name of quilt pattern must be on the entry tag.

80. Wall Hanging, max 48" x 48" (122x122cm), hand or machine quilted
81. Quilted Table Covering (runner, topper, cloth), hand or machine quilted
82. Crib Quilt, any design, min. 36" x 45" (91x114cm), hand or machine quilted
83. Lap Quilt, hand or machine quilted
84. Quilt, any design, hand quilted, by owner.
85. Quilt, any design, machine quilted, by owner.
86. Scrappy quilt, hand or machine quilted – **must be the work of one person**
87. Quilt Block, any design, pieced or appliqued, not stamped, mounted, min of 6" x 6"(15x15cm)
88. Quilt Top, any design
89. Pair Quilted Placements
90. Quilt, any design, lap or sofa throw - hand or machine quilted, min 36" x 48" (91x122cm). **If more than one person, all names on entry tag.**
91. Quilted Tote Bag or purse
92. First Time Quilt Exhibitor - any article pieced or appliquéd, hand quilted or machine quilted – **must be the work of one person.**

NOTE: All entries must be homemade, on a suitable size plate, cakes and loaves to be on tinfoil covered cardboard 1" (2.5cm) larger than cake or loaf, dome lid carriers may be used. All other baking to be in clear plastic zip lock bag. Tag to be taped to top of entry.

If you are entering the Maple Syrup Class at the Clinton Spring Fair level, please enter 1 Amber Grade 500 ml glass container, Kent style glass bottle (D&G #505188 Syrup Bottle with Handle) or equivalent of Maple Syrup, Canada Grade A – Amber, each having the capacity of 250 ml.

District 8 Competition: Please enter 1 Amber Grade 500 ml glass container, Kent style glass bottle (D&G #505188 Syrup Bottle with Handle) or equivalent of Maple Syrup, Canada Grade A – Amber, having the capacity of 250 ml.

Provincial Competition Rules: Amber Grade 500 mL glass container. Shall consist of two (2) curved Kent style glass bottles (D&G #505188 Syrup bottle with handle) or equivalent of Maple Syrup, Canada Grade A Amber, each having a capacity of 250 ml.

The following will pertain to Fair, District, and Provincial Competition. Maple Syrup should have a flavor characteristic of its respective colour, class, and be free from any objectionable odor or taste.

Any maple syrup entry containing any form of foreign material will be disqualified from competition. To be made solely by the person or family entering from the competition.

If entering the Liquid Honey class at the Clinton Spring Fair, please enter 1 clear glass container, having a capacity of 500 grams (375 ml).

District 8 Competition: Liquid Honey exhibits, please enter 1 clear glass container, having a capacity of 500 grams (375 ml).

Provincial Competition Rules: Liquid Honey exhibits shall consist of two (2) of clear glass containers, each having a capacity of 500g (375 ml).

Honey continued:

The following will pertain to Fair, District and Provincial Competition. Any honey entry containing any form of foreign material will be disqualified from the competition. To be made solely by the person or family entering the competition.

An approved colorimeter will be used to assess the colour.

CANNING

These items can be made in the summer and fall of 2024 to be judged at the 2025 fair. Canning to be shown in 500 ml or pint size jars. Jams and Jellies to be shown in 125 ml or 250 ml jars. All jars to be sealed except uncooked jam. Please secure tag on the top of jar with elastic. (Punch hole in tag and then put elastic through hole and fasten to top of jar).

DESIGNS

- 143 Miniature Design-A design with a maximum dimension of no more than 5” (12.7) in any direction including any container, base, or accessories.
- 144. Medium Design- A design with the maximum dimensions more than 6” (15cm) and less than 12” (30.5cm) in any direction including any container, base, or accessory.
- 145. Wayside Design - A design composed of common and plentiful flowers, foliage, fungi and/or weeds.
- 146. Dish Garden - Several horticulturally compatible plants growing in a shallow, open, portable container. Accessories may be used. Maximum of 20” (50.8cm) in any direction.
- 147 Fairy/Troll Garden - A miniature scene in a single container often reminiscent of children’s stories. Plants may be alpines, miniature or parts of larger plants but must have similar growing requirements. Accessories may be used. Maximum of 18” (45.7cm) in any direction.
- 148. Spring Planter -Several compatible plants artistically grouped and growing in a single open container for indoor or outdoor use. Maximum of 18” (45.7cm) in any direction.
